II. MINUTES

The minutes from the September 24 2018 meeting approved as written.

III. Report from Committees

Curriculum Committee: Gretchen Mahler presented the report of the curriculum committee's recommendations. The committee reviewed seven (7) permanent course proposals. CS 544 – Programming for the Web; CS 559 – Science of Cyber Security; ME 536 – Fundamentals of Additive Manufacturing Technologies in Turbine Engine and Gas Turbine Engines; ME 544 – Development for Machine Planning; CS 547 – High Performance Computing. These six (6) permanent course proposals were approved by Curriculum and Graduate Council and will be created

CS 544 – Technical Laboratory Anthropology. This unique new course will provide a mechanism for students to gain laboratory research experience. It is currently requested as a variable credit course of between 1 to 4 credits. The Council expressed some concern about the number of credits and the

course. Other requested changes included [...]. The department will be notified by Associated Dean in a manner with the requested changes. The course can be presented to Council and changes have been made.

This committee reviewed a Program Revision Proposal for the Master of Arts in English. The program is to include learning objectives and to ensure that all syllabi are in alignment with SUNY requirements. Gretchen reported that the requested revisions were made and resubmitted after the curriculum
